

New Medical Device Clinically-Demonstrated to Deposit Medication into the Sinuses

White Bear Lake, MN, Oct 19, 2010: Two studies presented at the 2010 Annual Meeting of the American Rhinologic Society (ARS) demonstrated the deposition pattern of the aerosol generated by the NasoNeb system in both pre-and post-surgical subjects. The conclusion of one of the studies suggested that the NasoNeb system may be a better choice for delivering a high concentration of medication in a low volume of saline when compared to the traditional sinus rinse bottle. Both devices are used for treating chronic sinus infections and the NasoNeb may offer a better solution to the 30 million chronic sinusitis sufferers
